

## **International Programs Task Force**

The Ohio State University community should define itself as a global university, fully integrated with other countries and peoples as a result of economic and technological advances. This should be reflected in all aspects of its teaching, research and service missions. The OSU community should stimulate and support collaboration with business and industry and with local, state, and federal agencies and organizations on an appropriately global scale.

### **Charge to the Task Force**

- Review current higher education documents on international affairs and patterns of international activity at peer institutions.
- Examine the status of the Office of International Affairs, its website and recent plans as developed by the Office of Academic Affairs; links to the CIC, MUCIA, and NASULGC; and its relationship with Battelle.
- Assess the current status and impact of current international activities on campus (University and college level).
  - **Research:** current research programs; interdisciplinary efforts; grant/contract activity; Fulbright Scholars; speakers' program
  - **Educational Programs:** study abroad; area studies programs; partnership programs; distance education opportunities; Denman forum
  - **Outreach:** enterprise development; Peace Corps programs; P-12 connections; international development programs
  - **Faculty:** exchanges; awards; promotion and tenure
  - **International Students:** enrollment trends; on campus activities; student organizations
  - **Structure Issues:** funding sources and availability; inter-institutional agreements; connections with national organizations/with State Department activities; data bases of campus activity; current institutional policies
  - **Development Goals:** current Development Office efforts to raise funds; priority activities to be supported with development funds; organizing development activities; processes involved
- **DEVELOP AND ARTICULATE AN INSTITUTIONAL COMMITMENT** to international activities with both short-term and long-term dimensions.
