At the meeting of COPE yesterday, we discussed various ways in which the physical environment of the campuses might help, or hinder, Public Safety in the performance of their responsibilities. The list below is almost certainly not exhaustive, nor are these matters which we think Public Safety can, on its own, resolve. On the other hand, if the leaders of Public Safety agree that these issues need to be addressed, that information will be very helpful to the university administration and COPE.

- Lighting. This is really a two part question. Is there sufficient lighting around the campus to enhance the safety of students, staff and faculty? If more lighting is needed, can it be designed to reduce light pollution and use less energy?
- Call boxes: number and locations.
- Bike paths and safety of bikers and pedestrians.
- Pedestrian safety, especially at cross-walks.
- Landscaping: are there areas where the landscaping may present a safety issue to the OSU community.

If I receive other suggestions from COPE members, I will pass them on to you. Also, I will be happy to discuss at greater length, the issues I have listed above.
