181 Credit Hour Plan for Early and Middle Childhood Education Major

Attached please find the revised curriculum plan from the School of Teaching and Learning (EDU T&L) for Early and Middle Childhood Education (EMCE) Majors, pre-licensure track available through regional campuses only. This plan allows students to complete the degree with a minimum of 181 credit hours.

After EDU T&L did a careful review of this program, it was discovered that undergraduate students were taking anywhere between 30-45 elective hours and much of the course work they were taking could be "double-counted" on the program sheet. This discovery allowed EDU T&L to utilize coursework more efficiently and effectively to facilitate the reduction in credit hours. For example, particular courses could now count as a GEC requirement and an area of concentration requirement, or as a major requirement and an area of concentration requirement.

The EHE Curriculum Committee and the College Council unanimously approved this plan.
