The proposed changes to the Professional Golf Management BS AGR update course offerings to remove a course that is no longer relevant to the major, adjust for course changes that have occurred since the last time the major was revised, and make corresponding adjustments to increase open electives in the major. This packet includes a proposed revision to the curriculum and supporting documents for the Professional Golf Management (PGM) program.

Proposed changes:

1. Remove CSFRST 2373 - Business of Fashion & Retailing (3 cr hr), from the list of Major-Supporting Coursework (prerequisites for required courses in the major). This course is now revised from when it was originally included in the major and is no longer relevant to the current program. Curriculum previously addressed in this course is now provided by other courses within the major.
2. Increase the credit hours for CSHPMG 2600 - Introduction to Hospitality Management from 2 to 3, to reflect the recent change in the course credit hours.
3. Add HCS 2502 - Basic Rules of Golf and Golf Etiquette (1 cr hr) to the list of required Major Coursework courses. This new course was not offered when the current PGM program was developed and is relevant to proposed program.
4. The net loss of 2 cr hr from the major supporting courses (current 5, proposed 3), and increase of 1 cr hr from the major (current 44, proposed 45) is offset by an increase in free elective courses (current 10-14, proposed 11-15)

The changes are requested by the PGM instructional team and have been approved by the Department of Horticulture and Crop Science Academic Affairs Committee. These changes do not affect the Program Goals and Outcomes, nor do these affect the Assessment Plan.

Policies and General Requirements for Degree

- A minimum of **121** total credit hours. Remedial coursework (English 1109; EDUTL 1001, 1002, 1003, 1004, 1005, 1006, 1007, 1010; Mathematics 1040, 1050, 1073, 1074, 1075) do not count toward the 121-hour minimum requirement for the BS degree.
- A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit earned through regular course enrollment at this University, and regular course enrollment in the last semester in the College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences.
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- Students are encouraged to participate in education abroad opportunities. Consult with your advisor for how education abroad credit applies to your degree or consider the CFAES Global Option.
- Students must complete a minimum of 40 hours in major/major supporting coursework with at least 12 hours taken from the academic unit(s) offering the major at OSU in the baccalaureate program.
- Courses required in the major (including major supporting courses and major electives) may **not** be taken pass/non-pass.
- Coursework taken as open electives may include a maximum of 4 credit hours of physical activity courses (all 1139-1197 courses), and a maximum of 4 credit hours of campus music organizations.
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Policies and General Requirements for Minors/Minor Equivalent

- The minor/minor equivalent must contain a minimum of 12 credit hours distinct from the major and/or additional minors (i.e., if a minor requires more than 12 credit hours, a student is permitted to overlap those hours beyond 12 with the major or with another minor).
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Coursework graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count in the minor. No more than 3 credit-hours of course work graded S/U may count toward the minor. Maximum of 3 credit-hours of xx93 are allowed to count in the minor.
