The Industrial and Systems Engineering program proposes to expand the set of courses that may be used to fulfill the Engineering 2301 requirement. With the recent proposal for the decimalized offerings of ENGR 2301 (ENGR 2301.01 and ENGR 2301.02), the program requests that both versions be accepted toward the requirement.

In addition, the program seeks to include Philosophy 2332 and Philosophy 2338 as approved course options.

The Engineering College Committee on Academic Affairs met on January 28, 2026 reviewed this proposal as an informational item. There were no questions or concerns and a College-level record of support for this proposal was created.
