# Health Law Certificate Update

Moritz College of Law

May 4, 2026

Moritz College of Law is requesting an update to our Health Law Certificate that includes the restructuring of required certificate coursework, the addition of two new courses that would count as certificate elective options, and the intent to make the certificate stackable toward the Master in the Study of Law (MSL) program. We are requesting this change to go into effect as soon as approved.

## Curriculum Updates

As the certificate currently stands, four courses are offered through the program, and all four are required for completion for a total of 12 credit hours. With the proposed changes, the program will still be worth 12 credit hours, but we intend to make the curriculum more flexible by requiring only two 3-credit hour core courses and giving the choice between four 3-credit hour elective courses to satisfy the six elective credit hour requirement. Please see the curriculum changes below.

Not only will this give certificate students more course choice, but it would allow the College of Law to admit students in the summer semesters due to adding a summer elective course option.

This curriculum change does not affect current Health Law Certificate students as we have not taken away any course options. Current students may still follow the current curriculum if they wish.

### **Health Law Certificate Courses (12 credits) – proposed curriculum**

#### *Core Certificate Courses – 6 credit hours*

Students **must** take the two (2) following core courses:

### **Stackable Option to Master in the Study of Law (MSL) Program**

We intend for the Health Law Certificate to be a stackable certificate toward the MSL program when combined with another graduate certificate program through the College of Law. Students will be advised at time of certificate application, as well as again at time of MSL degree program application, that for two certificates to successfully stack towards the MSL program, no one course can count twice (i.e., a course counted towards one certificate cannot count towards a second certificate, even if the specific course is part of the possible courses for both certificates). The flexibility of this certificate's curriculum gives room for elective course choice to ensure that students are selecting their coursework so that their 12 credits are unique to this certificate and the coursework for the other chosen certificate is unique to that program.
