Attached you will find a request to revise the Professional Golf Management major (PGM). This request has been approved by the Horticulture and Crop Sciences Academic Affairs Committee and the College Committee on Academic Affairs. The revisions are a result of several discussions with the PGA of America Education Staff as we continue to work toward accreditation. The PGA of America is requiring that the PGM major include a course in macroeconomics (ECON 201), cost management in food service (CS HSPMG 370) and business law (BUS-MHR 590). We are also being asked to require the General Business minor. As a result you will see the attached changes in the curriculum. Rationale for PGM Curriculum Revision

Ray Miller - Director of PGM, Chris Walsh - Asst. Director of PGM and Bill Randle - Chair, Dept. Hort. & Crop Sci. met with PGA of America, Education staff to review the OSU PGM curriculum being considered for accreditation by the PGA of America. Based on discussion at that meeting and subsequent correspondence, the PGA of America is requiring the following curriculum changes in order for our proposal for accreditation to be considered further.

- 1) all students must select General Business as their minor
- 2) macroeconomics must be added to the curriculum (Econ 201)
- 3) cost management in food service (CS HSPMG 370) must be added to the curriculum
- 4) a course with business law must be added to the curriculum (BUS MHR 590)
