Master of Social Work: Online Delivery

Carla and Denise,

The Graduate School Curriculum Committee (GSCC) met on February 26th and, among its agenda items, considered the proposal to deliver a specialization within the Advanced Standing Alternative Program (ASAP) of the Master of Social Work program in an online format. Specifically, the mental health/substance abuse specialization is scheduled for online delivery beginning Autumn 2015 and to be fully developed by Spring 2017. The ASAP is an accelerated pathway for students with a recent baccalaureate degree from an accredited undergraduate program in Social Work. There are no curricular alterations of the specialization other than the mode of delivery. The request follows national trends in the field and the proposal has been vetted and approved by Office of Distance Education and eLearning.

The proposal was approved by the GSCC. However, the GSCC noted the following:

- The details of how the field practicum will be established for distance students seem to remain outstanding. It will be developed with input from the field office within the College of Social Work (as opposed to a field office at the site of the practicum). Some clarification might be helpful.
- Table 2 is illegible in the proposal.

I will submit the proposal to the Graduate Council for their review followed by Committee on Academic Affairs. Following CAA approval, I will submit the change of delivery request to the Ohio Board of Regents for final approval. As always, I am available for any questions or clarifications.

Advanced Standing Alternative Program (ASAP) Online Program Proposal

<u>Overview</u>

Students who graduate from an accredited undergraduate program in Social Work are eligible to apply for the Advanced Standing Alternative Program (ASAP) which allows them to complete a Master's Degree in Social Work (MSW) by completing 43 credit hours of coursework and practicum. The College of Social Work has offered the ASAP option for many years and we anticipate an increase in applications due to the growing number of undergraduate social work programs nationally and the addition of undergraduate social work offerings at the four OSU regional campuses. In 2012 the College of Social Work initiated undergraduate social work programs at Lima, Newark, Mansfield, and Marion. These programs have been very successful and are expected to grow in coming years (See Table 1).

The popularity of the BSSW-program at the regional campuses increases the number of students who will be seeking an opportunity to complete the MSW degree as ASAP students by an additional 67 and 85 students in 2013-2014 and 2014-2015, respectively. For many of the regional students commuting to Columbus to complete the ASAP program creates significant financial and time-management hardships that will need to be addressed in the future. In the past we have offered more evening and weekend classes to accommodate commuting students but these efforts do not address the time and monetary costs of commuting to campus. These challenges are also present for the non-ASAP students who are enrolled in the regional part-time MSW programs. The regional MSW coordinators have indicated that it is difficult to recruit students to their programs when students must travel to Columbus to complete the advanced courses (advanced practice, specialization integrated seminars, and evaluation). One option to reduce travel time and costs while still providing students with a quality MSW-ASAP experience is to offer the ASAP program as an online option.

National Trends in Online Social Work Programs

Social work programs nationwide are offering online options for obtaining the MSW degree. One of the earliest and best known is offered at the University of Southern California (See <u>http://msw.usc.edu/about/usc-online-degree/</u> and <u>http://sowkweb.usc.edu/news/school-welcomes-largest-ever-class-online-graduates-campus</u>) but other universities are also offering online degree opportunities. In Ohio, Case Western Reserve University (<u>http://socialworkdegree.case.edu/msw-short-</u> <u>Ip</u>) is offering an online MSW program. One website provides a listing of "The 10 Best Online Masters in Social Work (MSW) Degree Programs" (<u>http://www.thebestschools.org/blog/2012/04/26/25-online-master-social-work-degree-programs/</u>) which includes Fordham, Virginia Commonwealth, Boston University, Florida State University and others. These online programs are increasingly available to students who might otherwise have enrolled in the CSW ASAP program after completing their BSSW degrees. For those facing one-two hour commutes to Columbus, these programs will be especially enticing. To remain competitive among MSW programs we need to move more aggressively toward developing and offering online options.

Current Status of Online Courses for the MSW Program at OSU

Much of the early effort to develop online courses in the College focused on the BSSW program offerings. Online options are available for most of the BSSW courses as well as many of the BSSW/MSW elective courses. For the 2014-2015 academic year, we are offering three BSSW pre-major courses, four BSSW foundation courses, three BSSW electives, six BSSW/MSW electives, and one MSW foundation course online. Together we are offering 33 sections of online courses in Autumn semester alone including at all four regional campuses. Each of these courses is evaluated at its conclusion and the overall assessments have been positive. Student feedback indicated that a couple courses needed to be revised and those efforts are underway.

Several MSW courses are currently being developed as online options and will be available in 2015-2016. These include the specialization seminars for Mental Health & Substance Abuse (SWK 7620 & SWK 7621) and the practice evaluation course sequence (SWK 7401 & SWK 7402).

Advantages of Developing a DL Enhanced ASAP option

There are several strong arguments for offering the DL Enhanced ASAP option. It is consistent with the university's goal of developing more online programs and is responsive to student requests for more online options. Other reasons for pursuing the DL ASAP are:

- An online option makes it easier for BSSW regional campus students to pursue an MSW. It
 reduces the time and cost associated with weekly travel to Columbus and provides more time
 for them to focus on their studies. Traditional face-to-face sections will still be offered for those
 who choose this format.
- The Office of Distance Education and e-Learning (ODEE) has resources to assist colleges
 interested in developing online programs (not online courses). They provide instructional design
 and production support for developing online programs and offer support in marketing the
 program to potential students. Their participation allows us to supplement the efforts of Kelley
 Cupp and Byron Roush to develop more courses, more quickly over the next 1-2 years
- Having an online ASAP option will make us more competitive with other programs currently offering an online degree. For in-state students, an online ASAP will be far less expensive that completing the online ASAP at CWRU.
- Revenue from online programs are distributed to Colleges without "central taxes" (especially for graduate programs). Table 2 indicates that over the next five years, the online ASAP program

(based on the assumptions presented) will generate almost \$2 million over current subsidies coming to the College.

Proposal for an Online ASAP Program at OSU

Given the number of online courses currently offered by the College of Social Work, we can offer an online ASAP program without much additional cost or effort. By spring 2015 we will have the integrated seminars for the mental health/substance abuse specialization (SWK 7620 & SWK 7621) and the practice evaluation sequence (SWK 7401 & SWK 7402) as online options. By initially framing the online ASAP program as a mental health specialization with a clinical focus we can identify the courses that are most likely to prepare students for this type of career. This is the most popular specialization and is selected by approximately 40% of the MSW students. In the future additional specializations can be offered.

Overview. The ASAP Program is an accelerated pathway for students with a recent BSSW to earn their MSW degree. Those meeting the admission requirements complete 43 credit hours of online courses and field practicum experience. The program is offered on a part-time basis with 1-2 courses offered each semester and students completing 672 hours (8 credit hours) in an approved field placement setting.

Admission Requirements. Admission to the DL Enhanced ASAP option may be restricted to those who have demonstrated a commitment to their social work studies by attaining a strong GPA (3.2 or better overall) and evidence of social work experience (i.e., strong volunteer or work experience).

Curriculum. The online ASAP program mirrors the traditional classroom experience offered by the College of Social Work. Students must complete the following requirements:

Specializations. Initially, the DL Enhanced ASAP option will offer only the Mental Health/Substance Abuse specialization. Approximately 44% of the students in the MSW program (according to the most recent Exit Survey) have selected this as their area of specialization. The integrated seminars for this specialization are currently being developed. In identifying priorities for developing online advanced practice methods courses, we can begin with those courses mostly likely to be of interest and relevant to the career goals of those in this specialization. Additional specializations can be added in the future.

Field Practicum. Students enrolled in the online ASAP option will complete their field practicum hours in their home communities. At least initially, the program will be limited to Ohio students so that we can rely on our network of over 700 agencies state-wide for field practicum opportunities. Students in the ASAP DL program will receive the same levels of support for field instruction with agency-based field instructors and college assigned field liaisons. The ASAP DL students will complete the same number of required field hours as the traditional ASAP students.
