CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY

The Certificate of Competency is an award to recognize the attainment of a specified level of proficiency in an occupational area. This certificate is awarded to students who meet a prescribed curriculum consisting of a minimum of 30 credit hours, generally considered the first year of an approved degree program. The program must include 18 but not more than 22 credit hours of technical courses and must include one course in each of the following areas: communications, mathematics, basic or applied science, and social science. To successfully earn this certificate, the student must achieve a 2.0 grade point average in the required courses of the program.

Each program offering a Certificate of Competency is approved by the Ohio Board of Regents prescribed program approval process. Requirements for this award are monitored through the same procedures as applied for degree programs. This certificate is issued by the University.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY

The Certificate of Competency is an award to recognizes the attainment of a specified level of proficiency in an occupational area. This certificate is awarded to students who meet a prescribed curriculum consisting of a minimum of 30 and a maximum of 36 credit hours, with the majority of the course work completed in a technical area. While this certificate is designed to have value apart from a degree, it should also serve as a building block to an associate degree. generally considered the first year of an approved degree program. Non-technical courses, deemed necessary for a specific area of study, should be included in the Certificate program. The program should include 18 but not more than 22 credit hours of technical courses and must include one course in each of the following areas: communications, mathematics/statistics, basic or applied science, and social sciences. To successfully earn this certificate, the student must achieve a 2.0 grade point average in the required courses of the program.
