This grade requirement will demonstrate that students have accomplished the teaching competencies in their coursework in order to proceed to student teaching.

This change was discussed and voted upon by Columbus and regional campus faculty and gained support across campuses.

Dual License in Visual Impairments

Admission: Students admitted into the Early Childhood Education major will have the option to also apply to a program that will provide the coursework to become licensed to work with children with visual impairments. As for the Early Childhood Education major, students interested in a dual license in Early Childhood and Visual Impairments should consult their academic advisor concerning admission to the program and planning for additional coursework.

<u>Required courses</u>: Students wishing to pursue a dual license in Visual Impairment Education will need to take the following courses in addition to the major above. EDUTL 5506 must be completed with a final letter grade of B or higher. All other courses must be completed with a final grade of C or higher.
