Attached are materials for the proposal to revise the *Higher Education and Student Affairs Specialization* in the Master of Arts in Educational Studies program in the College of Education and Human Ecology. It was approved on Monday, May 10, 2021 by the Graduate Council.

The Department of Educational Studies in the College of Education and Human Ecology is proposing to revise the *Higher Education and Student Affairs (HESA) Specialization* in the Master of Arts in Educational Studies. Dear Members of the GS/CAA Subcommittee,

My colleagues and I appreciate your consideration of our proposed changes to the HESA M.A. curriculum. Below in black bold, I address the committee's questions.

- The rationale for the curriculum change was not evident to the subcommittee. Could the revision please include a rationale for the curriculum change? Two primary factors led to the proposed revision.
 - a. First, the current curriculum is not fully in alignment with Council for the Advancement of Standards in Higher Education (CAS) standards for master's-level student affairs professional preparation programs. Specifically, the curriculum is lacking emphasis on legal and ethical issues and assessment.
 - Second, results from benchmarking our curriculum against those of ten peer programs underscored the aforementioned gaps and highlighted others.

To address these collective issues, we proposed the following addition to the curriculum: Assessment in Higher Education (previously considered a supporting/elective course). We also recommended replacing ESCE 6732: Theories of Professional Counseling with a more comprehensive ESHESA 7897: Special Topics in Higher Education and Student Affairs course that would cover legal and ethical issues as well as other noted topics of curricular deficiency (e.g., budgeting and finance). Additional adjustments to the curriculum were driven by CAS standards and benchmarking (e.g., moving ESPHE 7572: History of Colleges and Universities to a supporting course and shifting ESHESA 7540: Higher Education and Core Academic Issues to the HESA M.A. core foundational requirement).

- Will the goals of the program or the assessment plan change as part of the curricular revision? We do not anticipate changes in either regard.
- 3) How will the curricular change impact students who are currently enrolled in the HESA M.A. program, particularly students who have already completed courses that will be removed from the curriculum? Because of a temporary course substitution that was approved for second-year M.A. students, no graduating students have taken courses that will be removed from the curriculum. First-year M.A. students who have taken ESPHE 7572: History of Colleges and Universities were advised of the



possibility of this being changed to an elective prior to their enrollment in the course.

The faculty and administration of the College of Education and Human Ecology (EHE) approved the Department of Educational Studies' proposal to revise the Higher Education and Student Affairs (HESA) specialization in the Educational Studies master of arts degree. The proposal was approved by the EHE Curriculum Committee on December 17, 2020.

The HESA faculty proposed the following changes to the master of arts HESA specialization effective autumn semester 2021 (program hours remain the same):

Dear Graduate Studies Committee Members.

Over the past academic year, members of the HESA faculty benchmarked our M.A. curriculum against those of 10 peer institutions as well as national standards for master's-level student affairs professional preparation programs (see "M.A. Subcommittee Recommended Plan" for more information). In doing so, we noted several key points of misalignment that prompted us to make adjustments to our current curriculum. I am writing to express my support of the proposed changes and provide details on what the changes would entail.

As proposed, the new curriculum would not require any changes to the number of credit hours required for a HESA M.A. Rather, we are recommending the following adjustments.

- Changing the required foundations course <u>from</u> ESPHE 7572 (History of Colleges and Universities) to ESHESA 7500 (Introduction to the Profession of Student Affairs)
- Moving ESPHE 7572 (History of Colleges and Universities) to a supporting course (elective) option
- Replacing the ESCE 6732 specialization requirement course with Special Topics in Higher Education – Since the course is new, it would need to go through official review. Dr. Becky Crandall is teaching it as a seminar in Autumn 2020.
- Changing ESHESA 7576 (Assessment of Higher Education) from a supporting course (elective) option to a specialization requirement

My colleagues and I appreciate your consideration of our proposed changes to the HESA M.A. curriculum. Below, I address the committee's questions.

- On November 2, I met with Dr. Bryan Warnick, Philosophy and History of Education program chair. He was okay with HESA's proposed removal of ESPHE 7572 from the foundational requirement. This echoes Dr. Jackie Blount's sentiments when I discussed the issue with her last year in her role as program chair.
- Upon learning more about the Department's core foundational requirement, HESA faculty are
 now proposing that ESHESA 7540 Higher Education and Core Academic Issues serve as the
 required foundations course (instead of ESHESA 7500). This change is reflected in the new
 curriculum sheet documents.

In alignment with the Department's description of foundations courses as those that "focus on the historical, philosophical, comparative, psychological, or sociocultural study of education, and are informed by both disciplinary and interdisciplinary fields of study," the learning outcomes for *Higher Education and Core Academic Issues* are as follows:

- 1. to enhance our understanding of the structural diversity of American higher education;
- to introduce students to key issues in higher education administration and governance from historical, contemporary, and interdisciplinary perspectives;
- 3. to create a forum for the exchange of ideas and critical assessment of views presented in the course readings; and finally
- 4. to give students an opportunity to engage in independent scholarly writing on a topic related to higher education administration.
