In this memo, I respond to the minor comments on the Program Sheet for the Higher Education and Student Affairs (HESA) MA specialization in the Department of Educational Studies.

Transition Plan for Current Students

Current students who were admitted under the current Program requirements will continue
to follow those requirements through graduation. We have kept track of those students and
have advised them of which curriculum sheet to follow and will continue to ensure that they
meet those requirements.

Assessment Plan for the Program

• The proposed changes will not impact the assessment plan for the Program. The culminating experience for non-thesis students is a case exam that they complete in Spring of their final semester. Students will still complete this same case exam to assess their cumulative learning in the Program.

Anticipated Impacts of Proposed Changes

As noted in the first bullet point above, there are no anticipated impacts of the proposed changes on current students. Because current students will complete requirements of the current Program Sheet, we have the necessary courses in place to ensure students will complete these requirements. In addition, where appropriate, we will approve appropriate course substitutions for students to complete requirements in the rare chance that the proposed changes impact them.

Percent Change in Credit Hours

The percent change in credit hours is a decrease of 16% for the non-thesis option (43 to 36 hours) and a decrease of 15% for the thesis option (46 to 39 hours).

Dear Graduate Studies Committee,

In this memo, I discuss changes to the Program Sheet for the Higher Education and Student Affairs (HESA) MA specialization in the Department of Educational Studies and provide a rationale for these changes.

Credit Hours

- The required number of credits to complete the Program will drop from 43 to 36 hours for the non-thesis option (case study option) and 46 to 39 hours for the thesis option.
 - o In alignment with the Graduate School direction in reducing the number of credits in order for students to move through their graduate programs more quickly and incur fewer debt, the HESA faculty decided to reduce the number of credit hours.
 - O This reduction in credit hours also enables students to be able to complete the Program without needing to take more than 3 courses (9 credit hours) per semester or a summer course, which will contribute to students' wellness and reduce their feelings of being overwhelmed.

Required Language of Multicultural Course Requirement

- Change the language of the Required "Multicultural" Course to "Equity, Diversity, and Global Engagement."
 - O This language is more contemporary and is consistent with an approved change in a memo dated to the Graduate Studies Committee on February 10, 2022. It also aligns with the name of the Office of Equity, Diversity, and Global Engagement in the College of Education and Human Ecology.

Required Specialization Courses

- Move ESHESA 7530: Practicum in Higher Education and Student Affairs from a Required Specialization Course to Supporting Courses.
 - Over the past several years, the HESA faculty has observed that asking students to complete an additional 10 hours of a practicum experience on top of the 20 hours they are working in their assistantship has led to students feeling stressed, overwhelmed, and anxious. By moving ESHESA 7530 into a Supporting Course (Elective), which will be offered in the Summer, it allows students more freedom and time to devote toward a practicum without having other academic responsibilities.
- Remove ESHESA 8511: College Student Development II from the program.
 - O The HESA faculty has decided to remove this course from the program (with intention to archive it), and instead, require that students only take one college student development course ESHESA 7510: College Student Development. We will incorporate components from ESHESA 8511 into ESHESA 7510. This change reflects a move in the field where students are learning critical approaches to using student development theory. This change also allows more room in the curriculum to require a different course that will expand students' knowledge ESHESA 7513: Understanding Educational Organizations.

- Change the title ESHESA 7510: College Student Development I to College Student Development.
 - o The content that was in ESHESA 8511 will now be moved into one student development theory course (i.e., ESHESA 7510), which, as noted above, enables students to instead take ESHESA 7513 as a required course.
 - This will be submitted as a course change request soon, but wanted it reflected in the updated program sheet.
- Move ESHESA 7513: Understanding Educational Organizations from a Supporting Course to a Specialization Requirement.
 - o This change enables students to have a broader understanding of how educational organizations operate, which is useful for effective practitioners. It also helps to strengthen the higher education aspect of the HESA Program.
- Move ESHESA 7518: Leadership and Group Facilitation in Higher Education to a Supporting Course.
 - This change reduces the number of required specialization courses, thereby, enabling students to have more choice and flexibility in completing the Program.
