As such, we simplify our offerings for both students and advisors, expand proven programming to students outside the college, and provide the opportunity for our students to take a minor outside of our college related to their public affairs interests. The proposal to convert our specialization tracks to minors was unanimously approved by the Glenn College Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, via electronic vote, in the second week of May 2023.

The primary audience for the minor will be undergraduate students in the Glenn College and across the university who want to develop knowledge on the interface between public policy and the US education system, or their competencies in the functions of local government, or management and leadership competencies necessary for a public service career or graduate study in related fields. The program adheres to university standards for minors, while giving students ample flexibility to take courses that relate to an area of science policy of most interest to them. Rationale

This minor explores the critical societal role of local government. Local governments, both major cities and small towns, touch and impact the public daily, providing essential public services such as public safety, sanitation, water and sewer, and transportation services.

The minor introduces students to the challenges and opportunities that local government administrators and elected officials confront in serving the diverse needs of their communities. The minor addresses the context, responsibilities, and institutions of local government and introduces students to important leadership, financial, and analytical skills necessary to the operation and improvement of local government.

The primary audience for the minor will be undergraduate students in the Glenn College and across the university who want to develop their competencies in the functions of local government. Currently, the Glenn College offers a specialization track in Urban Policy and Management as part of our Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Sciences programs, but it is restricted to students pursuing a Glenn College major. This proposed minor builds on the foundation of this specialization but narrows offerings to those pertaining to the functions of local government and the issues with which it. The creation of this minor is part of a larger initiative to transition our specializations to minors. We currently offer five minors and six specializations, resulting in 11 subprograms. Ultimately, by transitioning our specializations to minors, we will reduce our offering to eight minors (no specializations). As such, we simplify our offerings for both students and advisors, expand proven programming to students outside the college, and provide the opportunity for students to take a minor outside of our college related to their public affairs interests.

Learning Goals/Objectives and Assessment of the Minor

Upon successful completion of this minor, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand financing of public services by state and local governments, including the fiscal relationships among local, state, and federal governments.
- 2. Identify local government problems and apply analytical tools to address these problems.
- 3. Understand the basic legal framework, common structures, and functions of local governments.

The minor in Local Government will be reviewed each year by the College's Director of Undergraduate Studies. Faculty from the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee will assist. Evaluation criteria will include the ability of the program to 1) deliver a high-quality educational experience to participating students; 2) attract enough students to demonstrate relevance and maintain financial stability; 3) achieve a satisfactory level of student completion within a reasonable time frame. The Glenn College will also conduct periodic review of the courses to ensure they are meeting the stated learning goals of the minor.

Administration and Resource Allocation

Advising: Student advising for this minor will be provided through the John Glenn College of Public Affairs' Office of Student Services, in cooperation with students' home college advisors.

Faculty resources: The Glenn College has ample capacity to frequently offer the courses required of the minor, both through core faculty and practitioner instructors. Foundational courses are already taught regularly as part of our major and existing specialization track and should easily be able to absorb the additional enrollments generated by this new minor.

Advisory Committee: The Glenn College will coordinate the minor through an advisory committee that will be appointed by the Glenn College Director of Undergraduate Studies. The committee will consist of Glenn College faculty and staff representatives. Other units on campus that have an interest in the minor (such as the departments of political science, economics, and the city and regional planning) will be invited to participate on the minor advisory committee.

Expected enrollments: We expect to attract 15-20 undergraduates in the first year. With effort and outreach, we hope to attract additional undergraduate minors over the coming years towards a goal of 50 undergraduate minors by 2025.

Requirements for the Minor

This proposal is fully aligned with the OSU policy for Undergraduate Minors:

An undergraduate minor consists of a coherent curricular program designed to allow students to pursue academic interests that go beyond their major. Students pursue minors to complement their major's area of specialization, to better define themselves academically and to employers, to gain credit for classes previously taken that do not count towards a major degree, or merely to pursue other interests. In addition, some academic units require their students to obtain a minor. Students may take any minor in any college provided that they follow the curricular guidelines set by the college or unit that administers the minor.

Specific prerequisites are kept to a minimum. The intent of the program is to serve as an integrative experience for students who want to learn more about local government administration and seek to bring positive change to their communities. Inviting students from all colleges to study local government together will enhance their ability to integrate different points of view and to learn to communicate across disciplines.

This undergraduate minor requires completion of a minimum of 15 credit hours. Given the requirements of the Glenn College's undergraduate majors, the curriculum of this minor will differ slightly depending on the student's program of study. Glenn College students will take three required courses and two electives, while non-Glenn College students will take four required courses and one elective.

Thank you very much for your feedback here, I apologize for the delay in responding. The Glenn College greatly appreciates having the support of WGSS with these minors. I chatted further with Dr. Jill Clark, our undergraduate studies chair, and we have the following thoughts regarding your comments.

- 1. We agree that it makes sense to outline the differences between the Social Justice and WGPP minors. There's definitely space for both of them, and they are both very important. We can add a paragraph to the rationale where we address the similarities and distinctions.
- 2. We are happy to add the WGSS courses focusing on race that you outline below. Do you have a list handy that you can share with us? If not I can look at the course catalog and add some more. We did have pause about including the courses from the WGPP minor though, because that might actually serve to confuse the two minors and defeat the purpose of including the language about how they are different. Do note though, that students can always petition for classes not on the list to count toward the minor, so I could definitely envision a scenario where we would approve a WGSS course not listed on the minor if it makes sense for a particular student.
