Dear Vice Provost Smith,

I am writing on behalf of the College of Education and Human Ecology's (EHE) Office of Academic Affairs. EHE supports the recent curricular change that was approved by the EHE Curriculum Committee on December 14, 2023:

- Allow the students in the BS programs in Human Nutrition—Dietetics, HDFS, and Integrated Social Sciences to take either SOCIOL 1101 or 1102 to fulfill their course requirements. Currently they can only take SICIOL 1101. The two courses are very similar in content.

The proposed change gives students more choices in the curriculum and requires no new resources to deliver the program.

EHE Curriculum Committee

Dear committee members,

I am writing to propose one small edit to three undergraduate GE-N programs (AU22 effective term): Human Nutrition – Dietetics, Human Development and Family Studies, and Integrated Social Studies Education. The change would add SOCIOL 1102 as an alternate option to SOCIOL 1101 in each program's requirements.

The Sociology Department recently altered SOCIOL 1101 to count for GE Foundations: Race, Ethnicity, and Gender Diversity. However, they quickly reverted the course back to the original GE designation of GE Foundations: Social and Behavioral Studies. In addition, they created SOCIOL 1102, which covers similar content, as a GE Foundations: Race, Ethnicity, and Gender Diversity. Students cannot take and receive credit for both SOCIOL 1101 and 1102.

We are proposing that these three EHE programs update their curriculum to allow students to take SOCIOL 1101 *or* 1102. Human Nutrition – Dietetics requires SOCIOL 1101 in Supporting Courses, Human Development and Family Studies in Supporting Courses, and Integrated Social Studies in Content Requirements.

Faculty representatives from each undergraduate program have agreed to the update. Please find department signatures below. If there is any further support you need, please let us know.
