Dear Curriculum Committee Members:

This covering letter is aimed at providing context for a proposed change to the Master of Arts – Adult Education and Human Resource Development specialization option in the Workforce Development and Education program. Specifically, we are requesting that the course ESWDE 8961 - Comparative Workforce Development Policy be included as a required course in this degree pathway. There would be no change in the total number of credits needed to complete this degree, but it would result in an increase in required credit hours to 15 (from 12) and a decrease in elective credit hours to 6 (from 9).

We propose this change to broaden the educational experiences of program participants focused on adult education and human resource development. Given the differing approaches to workforce development in general around the world, requiring students to participate in a comparative policy course on workforce development will add new perspectives to their understanding of key purposes and motivations behind adult education and human resources as a means of workforce development. Further, understanding the role governments play in responding to skills gaps in the labor market will allow students to contextualize learning from other required courses.
