Dear Sue,

The faculty of the Human Development and Family Science (HDFS) program propose a minor change to the curriculum of the HDFS Bachelor of Science (BS) degree program. Under Group B electives, we recommend the inclusion of HDFS 4998, Undergraduate Research in Human Development and Family Science, as an elective course with variable credit (1-3 hours) that counts toward the HDFS BS degree requirements. Although HDFS 4998 has been available for several years, it has not been explicitly included in the degree requirements. Historically, enrollment in HDFS 4998 has been low, with only a small number of students participating in the course each year.
